Head Teacher's Message

From Monday 11th November Godwin children will be able to walk, scoot and cycle to and from school enjoying a much healthier and safer journey. The banners outside school give details of the Healthy Schools Streets initiative which you were consulted on earlier this year. It is great to see that our children's work in promoting article 24 of the UNCRC – every child has the right to a clean environment – has had such a positive impact. Our MP, Lyn Brown, presented a petition to parliament earlier this year and our children have written to both Sadiq Khan and Rokhsana Fiaz about the need to ensure clean air.

Educational visits are something which we know really support our children's learning and are memorable experiences for them. We are delighted that our catering company, Juniper, has switched from single-use to re-usable water bottles for packed lunches. This is a great way of reducing plastic pollution, which our children are so knowledgeable about, and promoting a cleaner environment.
